Joseph Ferris
Prison sentence for Mayben

Prison sentence for Mayhem, Assault Dissuading a Witness and Attempted

Voluntary Manslaughter

Modesto, California - Stanislaus County District Attorney Birgit Fladager announced today that Joseph Ferris, age 47, of Modesto, was sentenced today after being convicted by a jury on November 9, 2009 of Mayhem, Assault with Great Bodily Injury, Felony Dissuading a Witness and Attempted Voluntary Manslaughter. Deputy District Attorney Annette Rees prosecuted the case for the People.

The case arose out of events that occurred on November 26, 2007. The victim, a former girlfriend of Ferris's, brought over their 2-month-old child. Ferris grabbed the victim and began brutally beating her inside his home. The ordeal lasted for over 5 hours. Finally, Ferris agreed to drive the victim to the hospital, but only after he concocted a lie to tell the police. Ferris's roommate--and fellow karate teacher--drove the victim's car to Ferris's karate studio where he parked it. The two then drove the victim to Memorial Medical Center where Ferris claimed that his ex-girlfriend had been beaten and robbed by two unknown men behind the karate studio. Modesto Police Officer Cox soon learned the truth and arrested Ferris. The officer noted blood on Ferris's hands and shirt.

The victim testified at trial and sobbed as she recounted the details of her ordeal. The jury saw photos of the victim's horribly swollen face – including, argued Deputy District Attorney Rees, "the tread marks of defendant's shoe on her face, her forehead, and her chest." The victim was hospitalized for 5 days and has required several surgeries since then. She said, "You have taken something from this family, my family, that we will never have back." The victim's young son, who had been a karate student of Ferris's, also spoke. "I trusted you. You are truly evil. I hope you never get out and do this to anyone else."

The Honorable John Freeland, who presided over the trial, sentenced Ferris to 11 years and 6 months in state prison.
