Modesto, California - Stanislaus County District Attorney Birgit Fladager announced today that Stefan Allan Glenn, age 20, of Modesto, pled guilty on March 11<sup>th</sup> to assault with a firearm, and admitted having personally used a firearm during the commission of the offense Deputy District Attorney Jeffrey M. Laugero prosecuted the case on behalf of the People.

The case arose out of events that occurred on March 8, 2007 in the area of Blue Canyon Drive and Keystone Way, in Modesto, when Glenn, then age 18, and a minor co-defendant were looking for a fight. The minor had been "disrespected" earlier in the day by some residents of the area and there was "bad blood" between them. The minor, knowing that Glenn was in possession of a handgun, contacted Glenn and told him he wanted to go "mess up" the "eastside fools." They returned to the area looking to even the score and found a group of males in a red SUV. An argument ensued and several more males came out of a nearby house. Outnumbered, Glenn and the minor got back in their car and fled. The occupants of the red SUV got in their car and gave chase. The chase ended when the minor turned onto Keystone and was cut off by the red SUV. Yelling and name-calling started again, with the occupants of the red SUV advancing on Glenn and the minor. Glenn, seated in the front passenger seat of the minor's car, rolled down the passenger window and fired five shots at the red SUV and group of males. The males ran from the gunfire. One of the males was shot twice, struck once in the right ankle and once in the lower abdomen. The victim was transported to the hospital where he was treated for his injuries and later released. An anonymous tip led police to the minor. Glenn was later identified and admitted his involvement. Glenn also led officers to the handgun used in the shooting.

Upon entry of the guilty plea, the Honorable Donald E. Shaver sentenced Glenn to 7 years in state prison.
