Violations of Probation Resulting

In State Prison Sentences

Modesto, California - Stanislaus County District Attorney Birgit Fladager announced today the following violations of probation that resulted in state prison sentences:

John Randall Anderson admitted he violated the terms of his probation by failing to abstain from using controlled substances and being unamenable to all treatment through Proposition 36. The defendant was originally placed on three years felony probation following his conviction on August 2, 2007 for possession of heroin. Anderson also admitted that he had served a prior prison term. This is his third violation of probation in this case. The defendant was also convicted of possession of methamphetamine on August 30, 2007 and was placed on three years felony probation in that case as well. This is his second violation of probation in that case. Upon the admission, the Honorable Susan D. Siefkin sentenced Anderson to three years in State Prison.

Jude Castaneda, age 38, of Modesto was sentenced to three years in state prison for Spousal Abuse after admitting to a violation of his probation. Castaneda was placed on probation for the offense which occurred on March 2, 2008. Castaneda violated his probation four separate times by failing to enroll and attend domestic violence counseling, leaving the county without permission of the Probation department and violating the order to stay away from the victim of the abuse.

Jeffery Lee Naylor admitted he violated the terms of his probation by failing to report to probation, failing to complete substance abuse treatment, failing to register as a controlled substance offender and failing to complete AIDS education. Naylor was originally placed on three years felony probation following his conviction on March 3, 2008 for possession of methamphetamine. He also admitted that he had served three prior prison terms. This was his second violation of probation in this case. Upon the admission, the Honorable Susan D. Siefkin sentenced the defendant to four years and four months in state prison.
